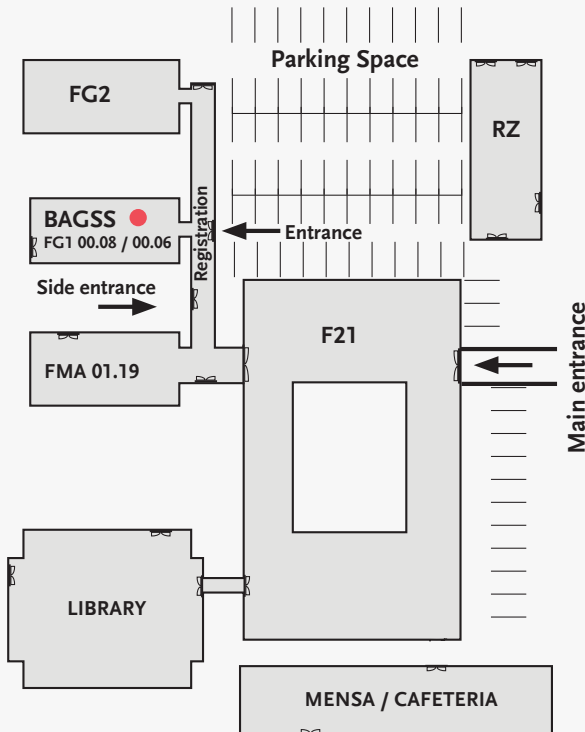

Busses leave at xx:14, xx:29, xx:44 and xx:59. Bus #931 stops at the train station and ends at the central bus station (ZOB). Bus tickets are available from the bus driver. The single fare is EUR 1.90, alternatively, you could get a multi-trip ticket for four trips which costs EUR 6.50. Please note that you have to pay in cash with the bus driver.
